QUITKIN, RIFKIN AND KLEIN'S DIAGNOSTIC CRITERIA OF ATYPICAL DEPRESSION

1. ANXIOUS MOOD/ DEPRESSED MOOD

Present, proceed to 2 Absent, stop Possible Atypical Depression PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

2. EXCESSIVE APPETITE
3. HYPERSOMNIA
4. WORSE IN THE EVENING

All 3 present, proceed to 5 Less than 3 present, stop

Probable Atypical Depression PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

5. MANIA/ HYPOMANIA

Present, stop Absent, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER ATYPICAL DEPRESSION

It consists of a total number 7 digits, based on 7 codes included in 5 variables organized into 3 decision clusters, yielding 1 diagnosis.

It is based on Quitkin, Rifkin and Klein's paper, "Monoamine oxidase inhibitors. A review of antidepressant effectiveness," published in the *Archives of General Psychiatry* in 1979 in which atypical depression is defined as an anxious-depressed mood, with overeating, oversleeping and diurnal variation. In revised CODE-DD it is characterized by anxious mood (depressed mood), with excessive appetite, hypersomnia, and worse in the evening.
