It consists of a total number of 35 digits, based on 35 codes included in 12 variables organized into 5 decision clusters, yielding 1 diagnosis.

It is based on Keller and Shapiro's paper on "Double depression: Superimposition of acute depressive episodes on chronic depressive disorders," published in the *American Journal of Psychiatry* in 1982 in which double depression is defined as a major depressive episode that is superimposed on dysthymia. In revised CODE-DD double depression is characterized by abulia (depressed mood or dysphoria) with disturbance of concentration (indecisiveness or retarded thinking), anhedonia (apathetic indifference or lack of interest), feeling of guilt (self-incrimination), asthenia (feeling of loss of vitality), loss of desire to live (suicidal tendencies), agitation (motor restlessness, motor retardation or stupor), hypersomnia (insomnia) and decreased appetite (excessive appetite) in the presence of the history of dysthymia.
