 7. MOTOR RETARDATION

Less than 3 of 4 present, proceed to 8 At least 3 of 4 present, stop Possible Uncomplicated Bereavement PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

8. ASTHENIA/ DECREASED APPETITE/ DECREASED SEX DRIVE/ MOTOR RESTLESSNESS/ MOTOR RETARDATION/ TEARFUL/ WEIGHT LOSS/ WITHDRAWAL

Present, proceed to 9 Absent, stop Probable Uncomplicated Bereavement PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

9. MANIA/ HYPOMANIA

Present, stop Absent, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER UNCOMPLICATED BEREAVEMENT

It consists of a total of 18 digits, based on 17 codes included in 9 variables organized into 5 decision clusters, yielding 1 diagnosis.

It is based on the 5th edition of Kaplan and Saddock's *Synopsis of Psychiatry, Behavioral Sciences, Clinical Psychiatry* published in 1988, in which the diagnostic concept of uncomplicated bereavement is formulated on the basis with consideration of Freud's (1917), Lindemann's (1945), Bowlby's (1961) and Park's (1983) contributions. In revised CODE-DD uncomplicated bereavement is characterized by depressed mood in temporal connection with loss of loved one with asthenia (decreased appetite, decreased sex drive, motor restlessness, motor retardation, tearfulness, weight loss and withdrawal) in the absence of suicidal tendencies, feeling of worthlessness (self-incrimination), impairment of adaptation at work (impairment of social adaptation) and motor retardation.

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UNCOMPLICATED BEREAVEMENT
