

At the time of preparation of *Early Years*, we did not know how many of those elected to membership in CINP from 1957 to 1962 would attend the XXth Congress in Melbourne.

In the last printed membership directory (1993-94), we found the names of 90 Fellows listed, including 15 founders, who were elected to membership in CINP from 1957 to 1962.
